PRIZE LIST

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- 1 Open to all farmers who are paid members of the Grey County Soil and Crop Improvement Association.
- 2 No exhibitor may make more than one entry in each class.
- 3 All entries must be placed between 9:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m., the day of the event and must be left until 3:15 p.m.
- 4 Transportation of exhibits will be the responsibility of the exhibitor in any and all classes.
- 5 Judge's decision is to be final in all classes. Prizes are to be awarded only to those exhibits the judge deems worthy.
- 6 Association will give every care to exhibits, but cannot be responsible in the case of loss.
- 7 Exhibits must each bear the proper identification, showing the name, address and variety.
- 8 Exact quantities are specified in the separate classes.
- 9 Prizes will be forwarded to the individual exhibitors as soon as may conveniently prove possible to the officers.
- 10 Exhibits must be current years produce.
- 11 Exhibits to Grain Classes #1-11 may be exhibited as bin run grain.

Classes:

Oats:

1. Any variety – 10 kg.

Barley

2. Six row – 10 kg.
3. Two row – 10 kg.

Mixed Grain (to be judged as feed, maximum 75% of one component)

4. Barley and Oats – 10 kg.

Wheat

5. Hard Red Winter, any variety – 10 kg.
6. Hard Red Spring, any variety – 10 kg.
7. Soft Winter, Red – 10 kg.
8. Soft Winter, White – 10 kg.

Corn

9. Dry Shelled Corn judged for feed 10 kg.

Oil Seeds

10. Soybeans – any variety 10 kg.
11. Spring Canola – any variety – 5 kg.
12. Flax—Any Variety—5 kg.

Legume Seed

13. Birdsfoot Trefoil – 5 kg.
14. Red Clover – 5 kg.
15. Alfalfa – 5 kg.

Grass Seeds

16. Timothy – 5 kg.

Potatoes for Seed

17. Any variety – 10 tubers.

Hay

18. First Cut Hay, 50% or more legume, 30 cm section.
19. First Cut Hay, 50% or more grass, 30 cm section.
20. Second Cut Hay, 30 cm section.

Silage

21. Haylage – 4 litres in plastic bag.
22. Corn Silage – 4 litres in plastic bag.
23. Barlage – 4 litres in plastic bag.
24. Balage – 8 litres in plastic bag.

High Moisture Corn

- 25 Whole Kernel – 4 litres in plastic bag.
- 26 Processed High Moisture Corn—4 litres in plastic bag.

Special Feed Classes:

(Judging to be based 60% on relative feed value, 40% on visual appraisal. Feed analysis must accompany entry)

27. First Cut Hay, 30 cm section.
28. Second Cut Hay, 30 cm section.
29. Haylage – 4 litres in a plastic bag.
30. Corn Silage – Relative Feed Value.
30. Balage - 8 litres in a plastic bag.

Prizes:

First prize as donated or \$4.

Second prize \$3.

Third prize \$2.

All other worthy entries \$1.

Special Feed Classes with Feed Tests

First prize as donated or \$14.

Second prize \$12.

Third prize \$10.

All other worthy entries \$1.

Points Will be Given On the Basis of:

1st prize: 6 points

2nd prize: 5 points

3rd prize: 4 points

4th prize: 3 points

5th prize: 2 points
